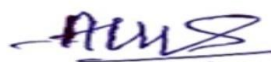

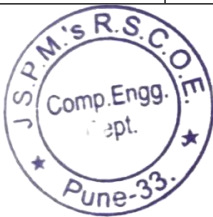

Following suggestions were given by members. ➤ Computer Networks Theory and Lab: • Dr. Anuradha Thakare recommended revising course outcomes using Bloom's taxonomy levels Apply, Analyze, Create. She suggested to emphasis on video lectures, demonstrations and discussions. • ADT suggested to divide the syllabus into three units on computer security and three units on information security and limiting Computer Network Lab strictly to network-related experiments, avoiding computer security labs. ➤ Machine Learning :

- Mr. Manoj Apte emphasized the need for students to **understand the problem setting** clearly. He recommended providing **problem statements for hands-on solving**.
- Dr. Anuradha Thakare highlighted the importance of explicitly **mentioning the Math Foundation course** to support applied ML and AI subjects. She suggested structuring ML Lab as: **Group A: Six lab assignments** and **Group B: Mini-projects**
- Dr. Anuradha Thakare and Mr. Manoj Apte emphasized solving problems **without using high-level libraries**.
- Mr. Tejas Vadalia suggested adding topics on **feature extraction** and **model deployment** on cloud.
- Dr. Ramchandra Sir proposed to add mathematical foundation and evaluation metrics in unit 1. suggested to use dummy data for demonstration and use real world data for practice for feature extraction and construction.
- **Artificial Intelligence (AI):**
 - Dr. Anuradha Thakare recommended making **one project compulsory** as part of the course.
- **Information Security:**
 - Mr. Manoj Apte suggested including **one representative algorithm** from each **security family**.

Resolution	<i>After detailed deliberations, the Board of Studies approved the proposed Third Year B.Tech Course Structure and Syllabus (2023 Pattern) for the CSBS Program, incorporating all the above suggestions. Subject coordinators are directed to revise course files, outcomes, and supporting materials accordingly, ensuring alignment with academic goals and industry relevance.</i>

B.Tech Structure and Syllabus under the 2023 pattern, effective from the academic year 2025-26. ➤ The key proposal included the addition of an "Advanced Data Structures" course to strengthen programming and problem-solving capabilities, as per industry trends and employability requirements. ➤ Dr. Anuradha Thakare, Hrishikesh Dhande emphasized the need of Advance data structure course for strong foundation building of computer fundamentals. ➤ Ms. Shital Borse, Training and placement Coordinator discussed the feedback from internship partners and placement drives indicated that graduates need stronger skills in data structures for roles in software development, AI/ML, and system design. ➤ Mr. Tejas Vadalia suggested that including ADS will ensure students have ample time to practice and master problem-solving skills, participate in hackathons, and prepare for competitive coding platforms (e.g., LeetCode, Codeforces, HackerRank). ➤ Dr. Suhas Patil suggested to replace "Calculus and Transform" with ADS course based on feedback indicating reduced direct application in core computer engineering subjects at this stage. ➤ Mr. Manoj Apte agreed saying as already 3 to 4 mathematics and statistics courses are included in curriculum, Calculus and transform course can be replaced.

	➤ The decision considered curriculum balance, credit distribution, course load, and alignment with AICTE guidelines and national curriculum framework recommendations.
Resolution	<i>The committee approved the inclusion of "Advanced Data Structures" and the removal of "Calculus and Transform" from the Second Year B.Tech syllabus of the 2023 pattern, to be implemented from A.Y. 2025–26. The syllabus revision will be updated in the official curriculum documents and communicated to all stakeholders.</i>

Discussion	➤ Dr. K. P. Moholkar, presented the proposed OBE Process and Attainment Policy for the 2023 pattern. The presentation included the structure for CO attainment calculation, where Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE) and Semester End Examination (SEE) are both assigned equal weightage of 50%. ➤ She informed the new Program Outcomes suggested by NBA in the latest form. ➤ She further outlined the Program Outcome (PO) attainment methodology, which adopts an 80:20 ratio of direct to indirect assessment. The indirect survey was proposed to be composed of four components: ➤ Exit Surveys – 10% ➤ Industry and Employer Feedback – 40% ➤ Participation in Co-curricular and Extra-curricular Activities – 40% ➤ Faculty Feedback – 10% ➤ Dr. K. V. Deshpande informed the formation of the Program Academic Coordination and Assessment Committee (PACAC) to oversee continuous monitoring of OBE processes and ensure quality in CO-PO mapping and attainment tracking. ➤ Dr. Suhas Patil suggested incorporating an annual review mechanism within PACAC to revise indirect assessment instruments based on feedback trends. He also recommended involving alumni in the exit survey process to gain insights from recent graduates' transition to industry or higher education. ➤ Mr. Hrishikesh Dhande suggested to reduce the weightage for industry feedback as very few industries provide substantial feedbacks and the sample size is too low. ➤ Dr. Neeraj Sathawane, representing the Industry Advisory Board, supported the 40% weightage for industry feedback, but stressed the importance of framing structured questionnaires and ensuring participation from a wide range of recruiters for better validity. ➤ Dr. A. D. Thakare suggested increasing the weight of faculty feedback slightly, as faculty have continuous and direct observation of students' technical and behavioral growth. ➤ Mr. Sushil Taskar recommended separating co-curricular and extra-curricular activities for more granular analysis. He also highlighted the need for defining measurable rubrics for student participation in these activities to ensure consistency across departments. ➤ Mr. Sushil Taskar also suggested to increase exit survey weightage to 40% as they give direct feedback on the complete curriculum and teaching learning process.

Discussion	Dr. Rinku Dulloo gave presentation on syllabus structure and curriculum for MCA-II 2025 pattern designed for academic year 2025-2026 as per NEP 2020. Dr. Kaiwade expressed the concern for research methodology subject, as it is having project. In third semester research subject the preparation of research project can be done. In fourth semester as part of self learning students can publish the papers in WOS , Scopus, IEEE, Peer reviewed journal. For IKS subject internal assessment can be done, students can give the presentation to enhance their understanding regarding the topics. Few subjects like programming and mathematical will require more time for solving papers , so they can be given 2:30 hours for End semester examination.
Resolution	After due Consultations and the suggestions of BoS experts, the proposed course contents of F.Y. 2025 & S.Y.2025 pattern are finalized with <i>Minor revision</i> .

Discussion	Dr. Abhijeet kaiwade gave inputs regarding framing of the syllabus, syllabus contents to be more simplified. Dr. Bamangol sir proposed to have track wise electives for more better understanding of the subject. Mr. Roshan also suggested few changes in subject of web technologies. Mr. Qaid gave inputs for cyber security threats and remediation , as it is current trend in industry in cyber security domain. Subjects in semester need to be balanced considering the difficulty of the subjects. So shifting of subjects to be done. Indian constitution subject to be considered as credit course , instead of non-credit course.

Mr. Roshan also suggested few changes in subject of advance web technology(semester 4) subject can have a mini project . Mr. Qaid gave inputs for cyber security basics as elective 1 and threats and remediation as elective 2 , as it is current trend in industry in cyber security domain. Subject shuffling of Design Analysis Algorithm with cloud computing , Multimedia applications with Basics of Data Science be done. Indian constitution subject to be considered as credit course , instead of non-credit course. Dr. Bamangol sir said semester 6 can have reesearch methodology subject so students will gain knowledge of it , those not persuing honours(4th year) will be benefitting by it.
