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The Need for Change

- Rajarshi Shahu Institute of Engineering is started in year 2001 by Jayawant Shikshan Prasarak Mandal (JSPM) with the aim of providing quality technical education and excellence in the ever expanding horizon of technical revolution of 21st century.
- The Institute is approved by the All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE) New Delhi, Directorate of Technical Education (DTE), Govt. Of Maharashtra and Affiliated to Savitribai Phule Pune University (SPPU).
- Institute is accredited by NBA thrice for all five UG Programs in year 2012, 2015 and 2019.
- Institute is NAAC accredited with 'A' grade (CGPA 3.26) for five years 2017-2022, extended upto 31st Dec 2024.
- Institute received Best Institute Award from Savitribai Phule Pune University (SPPU) in 2013.
- UGC recognition under 2(f) & 12(B) has been obtained in 2016.

- In 2001, the institute started with an intake of 45 in Computer Engineering Course, intake of 45 in Information Technology program and intake of 60 in Electronic & Telecommunication Engineering Course.
- In 2002, intake of Computer Engineering and IT Engineering Courses has been increased from 45 to 60 and started Mechanical Engineering program with intake of 60.
- In 2003, Civil Engineering program, Master of Business Administration (MBA) and Master of Computer Applications (MCA) program started with intake of 60.
- In 2007, ME program started in Electronics and Telecommunications (Digital Systems) with intake of 18 and in Mechanical Engineering course (Heat Power) with intake of 18
- In 2011, ME program started in Mechanical Engineering (Design) with intake of 24, Electronics & Telecommunication Engineering course (VLSI and Embedded System) with intake of 24 and Computer Engineering with intake of 18.
- In 2012, Direct second year of Computer Engineering started with intake of 60 and intake of ME Computer Engineering Course increased from 18 to 24.
- In 2013, Institute started PhD research centre in Mechanical and Civil Engineering, and a division of Direct second year Computer Engineering program started, with intake of 60.
- In 2017, institute started Electrical Engineering course with intake of 60.
- In 2019, institute accorded with autonomous status from UGC.
- In 2021, institute started two new programs: i) Automation & Robotics ii) Computer Science & Business Systems.
- Accredited by TCS & other various Industries.
- IIT Nodal Center for Spoken Tutorials, NPTEL Courses and Virtual LAB.
- Institute has excellent placement record and placement percentage has reached to 90%.

- Institute has Green Campus Certification. Green initiatives like solar energy project, Sewage treatment plant, rain water harvesting have been implemented in the campus.

Organizational Chart

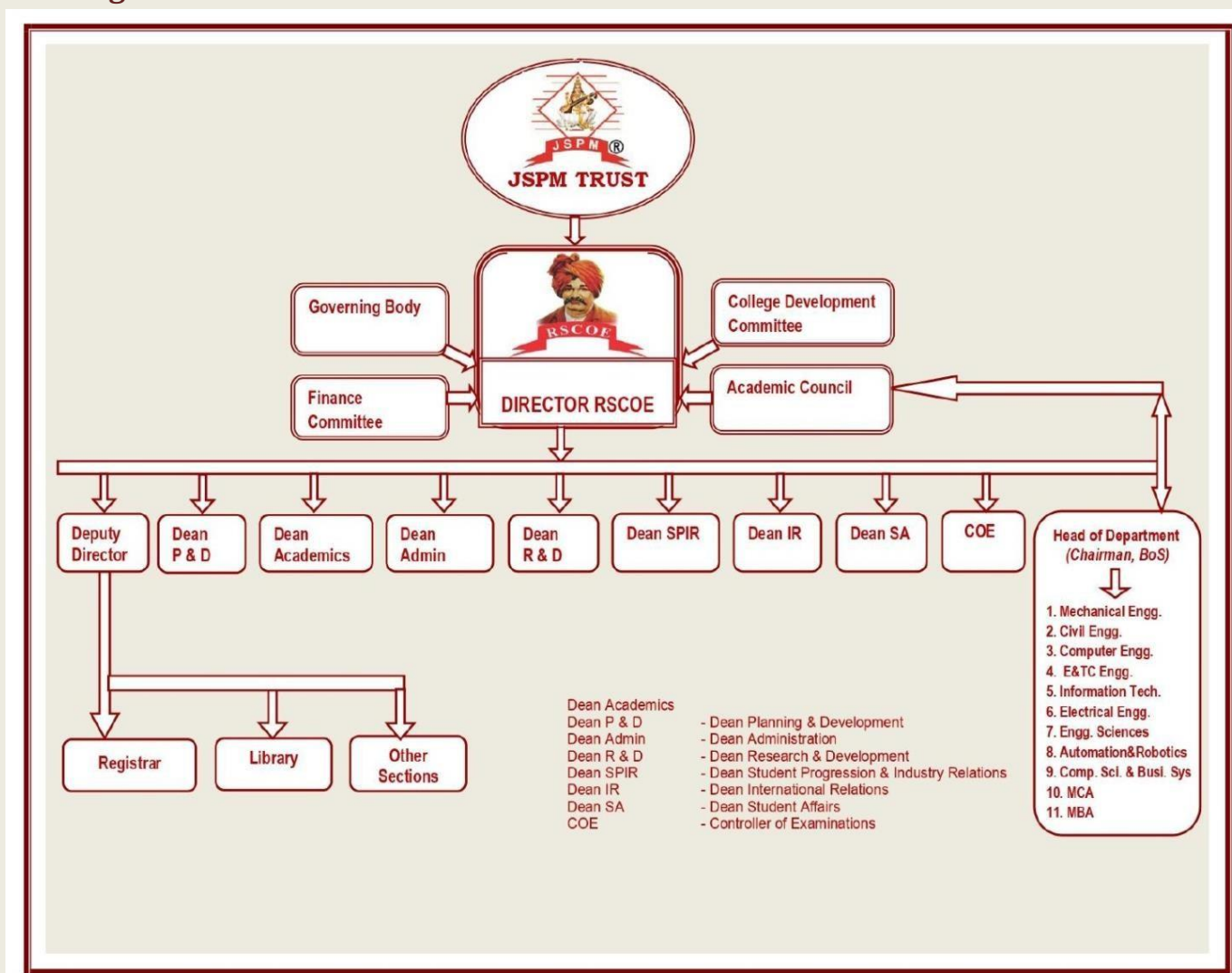


Fig. Organizational Chart

Term: The Governing Body shall be reconstituted every three years except in the case of UGC nominee who shall have a term of five years.

Meetings: Meetings of the Governing Body shall be held at least twice a year.

Functions of the Governing Body:

Subject to the existing provision in the bye-laws and rules laid down by the state government/parent university, the Governing Body shall:

- Guide the college while fulfilling the objectives for which the college has been granted autonomous status.
- Institute scholarships, fellowships, studentships, medals, prizes and certificates on the recommendations of the Academic Council
- Approve new programmes of study leading to degrees and/or diplomas.
- All recruitments of Teaching Faculty/Principal shall be made by the Governing Body/state government as applicable in accordance with the policies laid down by the UGC and State Government from time to time.
- To approve annual budget of the college before submitting the same at the UGC.
- Perform such other functions and institute committees, as may be necessary and deemed fit for the proper development of the college

Term : The term of the nominated members shall be three years.

Meetings : Academic Council shall meet at least twice a year.

Functions of the Academic Council:

The Academic Council shall have powers to:

- Scrutinize and approve the proposals with or without modification of the Boards of Studies with regard to courses of study, academic regulations, curricula, syllabi and modifications thereof, instructional and evaluation arrangements, methods, procedures relevant thereto etc., provided that where the Academic Council differs on any proposal, it shall have the right to return the matter for reconsideration to the Board of Studies concerned or reject it, after giving reasons to do so.
- Make regulations regarding the admission of students to different programmes of study in the college keeping in view the policy of the Government.
- Make regulations for sports, extra-curricular activities, and proper maintenance and functioning of the playgrounds and hostels.
- Recommend to the Governing Body proposals for institution of new programmes of study.

- Recommend to the Governing Body institution of scholarships, studentships, fellowships, prizes and medals, and to frame regulations for the award of the same.
- Advise the Governing Body on suggestions(s) pertaining to academic affairs made by it.
- Perform such other functions as may be assigned by the Governing Body.

BOARD OF STUDIES

Composition of Board of Studies:

1. Head of the Department concerned (Chairman).
2. The entire faculty of each specialization.
3. Two subject experts from outside the Parent University to be nominated by the Academic Council.
4. One expert to be nominated by the Vice-Chancellor from a panel of six recommended by the college principal.
5. One representative from industry/corporate sector/allied area relating to placement.
6. One postgraduate meritorious alumnus to be nominated by the principal. The Chairman, Board of Studies, may with the approval of the principal of the college, co-opt:
 - (a) Experts from outside the college whenever special courses of studies are to be formulated.
 - (b) Other members of staff of the same faculty.

Term : The term of the nominated members shall be three years.

Meetings : The Board of Studies shall meet at least twice a year.

Functions:

The Board of Studies of a Department in the college shall:

- prepare syllabi for various courses keeping in view the objectives of the college, interest of the stakeholders and national requirement for consideration and approval of the Academic Council;
- suggest methodologies for innovative teaching and evaluation techniques;
- suggest panel of names to the Academic Council for appointment of examiners; and
- Coordinate research, teaching, extension and other academic activities in the department/college.

Functions of College Development Committee

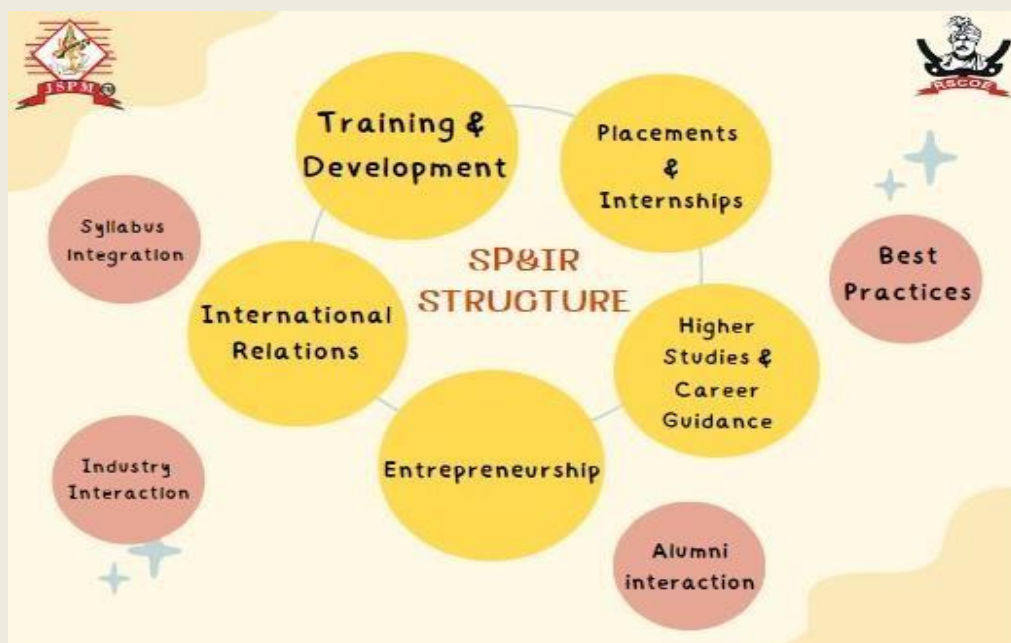


Fig: SP&IR Structure
