Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of RSCoE conducts **Academic and Administrative Audit (AAA)** on regular basis for quality improvement of academics and administration of the institution. It is a peer review process including a self-study, internal audit and external audit by peers from inside and outside the institution. The purpose of an academic audit is to encourage programs, departments and the institution to evaluate their quality processes and standards based on predetermined benchmarks. The report should suggest activities required to develop, maintain and regularly improve the quality of the whole system, curricular and co-curricular activities and support services.

It was proposed by the IQAC to conduct the AAA of all the programs under autonomous system and same is approved by Academic Council and Governing Body of the institute in their meeting held on 26th June 2025 and 12th July 2025

respectively. Accordingly, a "External Committee" under the Chairmanship of Dr M.U.Kharat vide letter number JSPM/RSCOE/admin/audit/2024-25 dated 09/09/2025 was constituted and consent of all the member were taken. A meeting of Dr M.U.Kharat, Dean IQAC, Dean Academics, Dr N.S Mujumdar, Deputy Director, and Director Dr. S P Bhosle was held to discuss about the process of the AAA and following points were resolved:

1. The AAA of all the programs (UG and PG) for the academic year 2024-25 are to be conducted.
2. AAA formats (Form 1, Form 2 and Form 3) were finalized.
3. It was also decided that after **Form 1** filled by all the individual faculty of all the departments a "Cross Departmental Audit" shall be conducted by "Internal Auditors appointed by the IQAC.
4. After Cross departmental audit "**Form 2**" will be filled by respective **Heads of the Department** and same will also be verified by the Cross Department Internal Auditors.
5. A meeting of all the external auditors shall be conveyed by the Director and all the members shall be briefed about the process by Director and Chairman of the Committee.
6. It was informed to all the auditors (External) that **Auditor's Evaluation Report "Form 3"** (for part I to Part VI for 450 marks) should check, be audited and checked by them based on the information provided in Form 1 and Form 2 or any other data (if required) and forward the same with suggestions and critical remarks to the "**Chairman of the Audit Team**". Finally, the Chairman should discuss with the auditors regarding their observation, suggestion and complete the form by adding the data related with institute level information (part VII of 50 marks) and with the discussion with each audit team member on the data for the remaining part (I to VI).
7. The Chairman and External auditor shall hand over the final report of the department (I to VII of 500 marks) to the Director of the institute for further transmission.

 - Last date for from 2 filling by HODs: 15th -25th July 2025
 - Last date for Cross Departmental Audit: 29 July 2025 to 01/08/25

The meeting with internal auditors was conducted for guiding them about audit process to be followed, objectives of audit and documents to be verified. Internal audit was conducted.

Step III: Dr.M.U.Kharat (Chairman of Audit Process) gave guidelines regarding process to be followed and documents to be verified during conduction of external audit, then external audit was conducted in physical mode. List of external auditors is given below. After Evaluation by external auditors, all audit findings and report of individual faculty and Department was compiled in "Format 3".

From the audit conducted and documents verified for all the Departments of the A.Y 2024-25 and discussion with external auditors.

The following strengths and weakness at institute level were observed during the audit process.

Strengths:

- NEP2020 is implemented with reference to AICTE model curriculum.
- UG admission are full
- PG admission for Civil and Mechanical are satisfactory but Computer and Electronics need to be improved.
- Motivated, experienced and dedicated faculty members. Many faculties are Doctorate and many are pursuing PhD.
- Effective curriculum planning with active involvement of faculty and industry representatives in Board of Studies, Academic Council and Governing Body was observed.
- Planning, implementation and execution of Teaching Learning process is good with effective use of ICT tools like Continueo and Eduplus is observed.
- Effective use of ICT in conducting proctored examinations and evaluation is observed. Good Academic Results were observed.
- Infrastructure and Laboratories such as Industry 4.0, MAC Lab, IIF for innovation were observed and few Centre of studies can be planned.
- Institute shows futuristic approach by designing Strategic Plan.
- Governing Body, Academic Council and Board of Studies are formed as per UGC norms and regular meeting were conducted.
- Grievance committee, Anti ragging committee and other committees exists and meetings are conducted on need basis and documents were maintained.
- Involvement of faculty members at various academic, administrative committees is observed.
- Faculty members are hard-working, energetic and taking duties and responsibilities seriously.
- Exam rules and regulation book were framed and have been disseminated with students and faculty.
- Grievance committee is in place and documents were maintained.
- Examination process is properly planned, open, transparent and accountable.
- External faculty is involved in exam related activities for better quality.
- College has Incentive scheme for Motivation, Awards like Best Faculty, Best GFM, Best Department were given.
- 5-UG programs and 2- PG programs are NBA Accredited in Tier-II and the same 5- UG Program have applied for Tier-I accreditation by NBA.

Chairman's Report

With reference to the AAA the final review meeting was held on 19th Sept 2025 by the chairman, Dr. M.U.Kharat with the all HoD's, Dean's to finalize the minutes of the Audit

Areas of Improvements based on AAA:

- Improvement in faculty cadre ratio is proposed. More number of experienced faculty members is needed.
- Enhancement of quality research publications in reputed SCI and Scopus Journals and Scopus Conferences.
- Advised to apply for Research and Consultancy-based projects from UGC/DST/AICTE/ etc. and industry.
- Seed funding for RESEARCH should be enhanced for students and faculty members.
- Automation and ERP software for administrative work to be improved.
- Infrastructure is available as per AICTE norms and satisfying the academic need.
- More number of Centre-of-Excellences can be established in association with Industry/R&Ds.
- Flexibility in allocated budget for respective area and research work can be planned.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

Between

King Mongkut's Institute of Technology Ladkrabang

And

JSPM's Rajarshi Shahu College of Engineering, Pune



I PURPOSE

The purpose of this MOU is to develop academic and educational cooperation on the basis of equality and reciprocity and to promote sustainable partnerships and mutual understanding between **King Mongkut's Institute of Technology Ladkrabang**, hereinafter, referred to as "KMITL" in THAILAND and **JSPM's Rajarshi Shahu College of Engineering at Pune, India** hereinafter referred to as "JSPM's RSCOE" in Pune, India. Both KMITL and JSPM'S RSCOE may be referred to individually as the "party" or collectively as the "parties".

II SCOPE OF ACTIVITIES

KMITL and JSPM'S RSCOE aim to undertake cooperation in areas that may include, but are not restricted to, the following:

- a) Student exchange for research and study,
- b) Exchange of faculty, staff and research scholars,
- c) Joint research activities,
- d) Continuing education programs,
- e) Organization and participation in seminars, symposia, short-term academic programs and academic meetings,
- f) Exchange of research and educational materials, publications and academic information
- g) Technical assistance,
- h) Creation and marketing of electronic instruction media, including credit and non-credit courses.

III ACTIVITY AGREEMENTS

Before any activities may be implemented, the parties shall discuss the relevant issues to the satisfaction of each party and enter into specific activity agreements based on the mutually agreed objectives and outcomes of the activity. Activity agreements will include such terms as the following:

- a) Elaboration of the responsibilities of each institution for the agreed upon activity,
- b) Specific schedules for the activity.

- c) Budgets and sources of finance for the activity.
- d) Detailed management of intellectual property rights and publications.
- e) Any other items deemed necessary for the efficient management of the activity.

IV COORDINATORS

Coordinators shall be named by each institution to serve as liaison for implementing this MOU. All activities conducted under the auspices of this MOU must have the endorsement of the coordinators. At **KMITL**, the coordinator will be Asst. Prof. Dr. Kanoknuch Songsuwankit, Assistant Dean for International Affairs, School of Engineering and at **JSPM'S RSCOE**, the coordinator will be Dr. Binod Kumar, Dean of International Relations. Coordinators shall notify their counterparts should a new person be named to the position.

V SETTLEMENT OF DIFFERENCES

Any disagreements or differences in the interpretation of this MOU will be settled in an amicable way by mutual negotiation or consultation.

VI RENEWAL, TERMINATION AND AMENDMENT

- This MOU shall remain in force for a period of five (5) years from the date of the last signing. This MOU may be extended by the written consent of the parties.
- This MOU may be terminated by either party giving written notice to the other party at least six (6) months in advance of the stated termination date. Termination of this MOU shall not affect activities in progress pursuant to specific activity agreements, which shall continue until concluded by the parties in accordance with their terms or as otherwise agreed to by the parties in writing.
- This MOU may be amended only by the written consent of the parties.

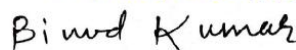

Memorandum of Understanding (MOU)
Between
Rajarshi Shahu College of Engineering
&
LAWRENCE TECHNOLOGICAL UNIVERSITY (LTU)

Purpose

This memorandum of understanding (MOU) summarizes an educational partnership agreement between Rajarshi Shahu College of Engineering and Lawrence Technological University College of Engineering. The relationship will foster collaboration, communication and partnership for faculty, students and administration.

Agreement Components

- Develop a study abroad program for spring of 2025 for a cohort of 25 students to pursue 9 to 12 graduate credits in one of LTU's College of Engineering Master of Science Degrees. program.
- Cooperation in a range of collaborative academic and instructional endeavors, including

 - Faculty and student exchanges based on reciprocity.

 - Joint conferences and workshops.
 - Online courses as well as team-taught courses.
 - Visits from academics, professionals, and students
- LTU will develop an academic and career program with our College of Engineering for up to 30 students from Rajarshi Shahu College of Engineering in the summer of 2025 for two weeks in July to work with LTU Industry partners, faculty and our students.
- Develop a faculty committee with mutual faculty from both universities to identify opportunities to support research activities, support and resource's
- Develop an International Engineering/Technology "intensive" field course between JSPM's Rajarshi Shahu College of Engineering and LTU
- Develop Joint degrees in the fields of Computer, Civil, Electrical, Engineering Technology and Mechanical from UG, MS & PhD where applicable

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

between

JSPM's Rajarshi Shahu College of Engineering, Department of Civil Engineering
Tathawade, Pune, 411 033, Maharashtra, India

and

Czech Technical University in Prague, Faculty of Civil Engineering
Thákurova 7, 166 29 Prague 6, Czech Republic

This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is entered into on this 17 day of March, 2025 for the purpose of promoting the institutional goals of both Universities, hereinafter referred to as "Parties", who agree that cooperation in research collaborations and student and faculty exchanges would be mutually beneficial. The areas of cooperation may include, subject to mutual consent, any desirable and feasible activity that would further the goals of each institution. Such interaction may include cooperation in a variety of joint academic and educational activities such as:

- Promoting interest in the teaching and research activities of the respective institutions
- Participation in a variety of teaching and/or research activities and professional development
- Staff and student exchanges based on reciprocity
- Joint educational and research projects and publications
- Exchange of information and documentation including sharing of teaching material, publications, results of implementation of new technologies and research

This Memorandum of Understanding shall not be construed as creating any legal or financial relationship between the Universities, but as a statement of intent to foster the possibility of genuine and mutually beneficial collaboration.

§ 1

1.1 Both Universities agree to facilitate opportunities for staff exchange. Duration of each stay at the host university may range from 2 days to one month or as mutually agreed by both Universities.

1.2 For a period of exchange, each sending University will cover the costs of boarding, lodging, travel, health insurance of outgoing staff, unless mutually agreed otherwise. Specific arrangements for special facilities, laboratories, faculty compensation, expenses, health insurance, housing etc. will be agreed upon by both Universities in advance. Each University shall also be responsible for its own staff's salaries during the exchange program. The host University will grant the same study and research facilities as those available to the resident staff.

1.3 The staff under the exchange programs is expected to study and work according to their own plan for professional improvement and research and to the mutually agreed purpose of the exchange.



1.4 Visiting staff may be authorized to teach regularly scheduled classes and seminars during each academic term at the host University in the area of their expertise.

1.5 Under this MoU, all staff exchange shall abide by rules and regulations, in effect at the host University

§ 2

2.1 Both Parties agree to facilitate the exchange of students for cultural and academic purposes as mutually agreed. The period of such exchange program may range from one month to one academic year or as mutually agreed by both Universities with the limit of 4 students per academic year from each university. Cooperation and exchanges may take place with undergraduate, graduate, or doctoral students. Any mobility outside the regular scope must be communicated and agreed upon in advance.

2.2 Prior to the beginning of the student exchange program, each University will provide the host University with a list of students, their bio data (name, surname, date of birth, sex, study cycle and field of study), certificates of language competence and the study plans. To earn credits at the host University, the student must complete all relevant application forms and fulfill all requirements of the host University. Each student under the exchange program will cover the costs of travel and all related expenses, unless mutually agreed otherwise.

2.3 The host University agrees to provide co-ordination and support for assisting students under the exchange programs by providing relevant information.

2.4 The host University agrees to provide appropriate facilities necessary to support the exchange at the host University.

§ 3

3.1 Both Universities agree to work towards the establishment of mutual cooperation for common research and to undertake joint research projects as mutually agreed upon well as to identify and provide, upon request, contact person for specified program activities.

3.2 If two faculty members from each institution are engaged in collaborative research projects, doctoral students at one institution may visit and work in the lab of the faculty member at the other institution and incorporate the work done as part of their dissertation research.

3.3 The parties shall enter into specific written agreements whenever appropriate to clarify and define the nature, extent, and terms of operation for the proposed collaborations, including intellectual property ownership and funding issues. Any agreement entered into by these two institutions will require the approval of appropriate officers from each institution. All agreements and activities covered under this MOU or entered into by the parties must comply with all applicable laws and regulations.

§ 4

This Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) shall be effective for a period of five years from the signature date unless terminated earlier. Both Universities may renew the MoU for such period and on such terms as they deem appropriate. Each institution will have copies of this agreement.

No modifications, waivers or amendments of any terms of this MoU shall be effective unless and until agreed in writing and signed by the duly authorized representatives of both Universities.

Either University may terminate the Agreement at any time without assigning any reason by giving a written notice 3 months in advance to the other University. Such termination shall not affect the programs already scheduled and they will be completed as agreed.

EXCHANGE AGREEMENT

between

**VSB – TECHNICAL UNIVERSITY OF OSTRAVA
(CZECH REPUBLIC)**

and

**JSPM's RAJARSHI SHAHU COLLEGE OF ENGINEERING, PUNE
(INDIA)**

In recognition of the mutual benefits derived from scholarly interaction, VSB – Technical University of Ostrava (further referred to as "VSB-TUO") and JSPM's Rajarshi Shahu College of Engineering (further referred to as "RSCOE") agree to establish the following Exchange Agreement (further referred to as "Agreement").

1. DEFINITIONS

For the purpose of this Agreement, "home" institution shall mean the institution at which the student intends to graduate, and "host" institution shall mean the institution which has agreed to accept the student from the home institution.

Semester or academic year shall normally refer to the period relevant to the host institution.

2. PURPOSE OF THE AGREEMENT

The general purpose of this Agreement is to establish specific educational relations and cooperation between the two participating institutions in order to promote academic linkages and to enrich the understanding of the culture of the two countries concerned.

The purpose of exchange between faculty members is to promote collaborative research, other educational developments and to further mutual understanding.

The purpose of each student exchange is to enable students to enrol in courses at the host institution for credits which will be applied towards their degrees at their home institution and/or to participate in the traineeship at the host institution if relevant.

3. STUDENT EXCHANGES

(1) NUMBER

Each institution is prepared to send students and receive the equivalent number in exchange annually. Normally the exchange will involve a maximum of 2 students per academic year from each institution or 4 students per semester from each institution

annually.

The deadline for submitting students' application documents to RSCOE is:

31 October for winter semester

31 May for summer semester

The deadline for submitting students' application documents to VSB-TUO is:

30 April for winter semester

31 October for summer semester

(2) QUALIFICATIONS

Each exchange student should demonstrate his/her academic proficiency by a certified Transcript of Records.

Contracting universities are responsible for nominating for exchange program well-qualified students with appropriate academic background and sufficient English language proficiency.

The language requirements of RSCOE are as follows:

For programs in English recommended level of English: B2 (upper intermediate);

The language requirements of VSB-TUO are as follows:

For programs in English recommended level of English: B2 (upper intermediate);

(3) COST

(a) Tuition

Students will pay their regular tuition and fees to the home institution. No further tuition costs will be charged by the host institution.

(b) Board and Room Charges

Each student will receive full assistance from the host institution in locating suitable accommodation. The cost of accommodation, including food, is the responsibility of the exchange student.

(c) Transportation

Each student is responsible for his/her own international transportation costs (unless special arrangements are made by the home institution).

(d) Medical Insurance

Each exchange student is responsible for making arrangements for a suitable insurance plan, which must include sufficient medical coverage. The cost of the insurance will be paid by the exchange student (unless special arrangements are made by the home institution). Proof of sufficient insurance coverage must be provided to the International Office of the host university.

4. GENERAL PROVISIONS

(1) ACADEMIC CONTENT

Exchange will conform to the requirements of the home institution. Exchange students will be subject to the rules and procedures as specified in the host institution's handbook for the academic year in which they enrol.

- (a) Students are to be undergraduates, graduates or doctoral students and preference will be given to students who have completed at least their first year of undergraduate study at the home institution.
- (b) Exchange students will participate in the normal academic courses offered by the host institution. With the consent of the host institution, exchange may take a form other than academic studies, such as traineeship.
- (c) In selecting courses, students may choose from the range of courses offered at appropriate institution. The responsible officers will inform each other about any courses which may limit enrolment and will make every effort to assist students in enrolling in such courses.

(2) EXCHANGE STUDENTS' RECORDS

Prior to the final selection of students for participation in the exchange programme, each institution will provide the other with information about the performance and academic background and records, together with letter of recommendation. It is understood that both institutions will strive to select only individuals of the highest quality for participation in the programme. Each institution reserves the right of prior approval of the individuals nominated by the partner institution.

(3) ACADEMIC RESOURCES

Each student will be provided with the same academic resources and supporting services as are normally provided to others at the host institution of the same academic level. An academic adviser will be designated to assist students enrolled in the exchange programme.

(4) ACADEMIC CREDITS

Details pertaining to academic credits will be negotiated separately and will not be part of this Agreement. Negotiations on academic credit transfer will be undertaken by exchange of Learning Agreements between appropriate officers at each institution.

(5) EXCHANGE STUDENTS' FAMILIES

It is not anticipated that spouses or dependants will accompany any of the students. Where such an arrangement is proposed, it is subject to the approval of the host institution on the understanding that all additional expenses incurred by accompanying spouses or dependents are the responsibility of the individual exchange student.

5. FACULTY MEMBERS AND STAFF EXCHANGES

It is estimated that there will be an exchange of academic staff who will give a series of lectures for periods of time ranging from a week to a semester. The two institutions agree in principle to the possibility of other staff exchanges as well. The details of such arrangements will be negotiated at the appropriate time.

6. ADMINISTRATION

(1) ANNUAL PROGRAMME CALENDAR

Exchanges may take place for an academic year, or for either semester. A student who leaves the programme early for any reason is not entitled to a refund of tuition paid at the home campus or any accommodation charges assessed at the host institution.

(2) PROGRAMME REVIEW

Both institutions will be responsible for a regular review of the programme no later than April 1 of each year. This review may make appropriate and mutually agreed modifications as required and identify new opportunities for cooperation in scholarship and research.

7. TERMINATION

The Agreement shall enter into force on the date of its signing by both institutions and shall remain in force for five (5) years. Either institution may, by giving ninety days written notice to the other institution, terminate the Agreement. In the absence of such and early termination, the renewal of this Agreement shall be reviewed by the two institutions no less than ninety days prior to the natural termination of the current Agreement. The termination of this Agreement shall allow for any participating students who have commenced at either institution at the date of the termination to complete their approved course of study. This Agreement may be amended or modified at any time by the mutual consent of the cooperating institutions.
